- Year 3 of C21 curriculun at Cardiff University School of Medicine
- 2019/20 Bangor cohort




Background

- Phase 2 of the C21 curriculum
 - Year 3 Medicine, surgery, emergency medicine, acute medicine, general practice
 - Year 4 Psychiatry, neurology, paediatrics, obstetrics and gynaecology, ophthalmology, care of the elderly, orthopaedic surgery, rheumatology

Methods



- Anonymous reflective notes from all consultations undertaken by one student during the academic year were reviewed
- Patients' presenting complaints were noted and subsequently categorised presenting complaints according to which placement they would best fit on the traditional block-based MBBCh curriculum
- Any additional learning opportunities that arose from the consultation were also noted

- Consultations undertaken
- 188 different patients
- Opportunity to review patients unique for medical students



Results: Skills

CARER is also an opportunity to practice skills that a hospital-based year 3 student might not:

- Clinical communication and examination during independent appointments
- Prescribing
- Written referral letters and telephone referrals to secondary care

- Paid work at practice's medication dispensary
- Consulting with patients over the phone and video link
- All made possible by the fact that CARER students become part of the practice team



Conclusions and Recommendations



CARER aids students in addressing year 3 and 4 learning outcomes



CARER can be an opportunity to use the Welsh language in practice



Year 4 could be adapted to reflect the experiences of those who complete CARER in year 3
